I mean, it's not necessary to have huge amounts of money in order to enjoy yourself. I enjoy myself when I was earning \$10,000 and I live in the same house that I lived in when I was making when I had about that. I bought it forty-one years ago, I liked the house then I like the house now.





I mean, if you think about it, if you have a reasonable job you'll be eating at McDonald's and I'll be eating McDonald's so, we're to push on food, I mean, you know, I hope in fact, I hope is Dairy Queen actually.

And if you come to Dairy Queen, you'll see me, and you can order anything on the menu I can order, we both can afford it.

You know you'll wear the same clothes I wear, I'll pay more for my suits, but as soon as I put them on they look cheap on me, so we'll look about the same.

<u>We'll both live in the same kind of houses</u>, I live in that house from forty-one years ago, and it's warm in winter and it's cool in summer and it's comfortable, and you'll live in a house that's similar.

And *what difference does it make if you have fifty more rooms* or, you know, guest houses or all that? You know, *it'll probably just bring your problems,* I mean, you have to worry about the greenskeeper or something when you get through.

So, I have been in the houses of people where the houses are worth oh, probably two hundred times what my house is worth, and *I would not be any happier in those houses at all,* in fact, *I'd be less happy.*



<u>I just have one more thing to worry about,</u> you know, the dozens of people around the place and people quitting and people stealing from you, all kinds of things the hell with it though.

We drive, *we'll drive the same kind of car,* in fact, you'll probably drive a better car, I drive a car that's about eight years old, I don't know what it's worth now. But it gets me around fine, I mean, I'm perfectly happy with it.

<u>We'll watch the same television</u>, you know, we'll work on the same computer pretty much, *the only difference will be how we travel long distances*, you know.





I will fly in a plane that's more comfortable than flying Southwest Airlines or something, which I've got nothing against, but that's the one real big difference.

And other than that I do what I like every day I hope you you'll do what you like every day to do.

And I work with nice people, I hope you work with nice people. And there are twenty-hours in the day, and those are where the hours go.

So, great wealth is the tiniest bit different in a real sense than having just a decent, a decent income.



And to trade a decent income, and something you love doing, and something where you feel *worthwhile* doing it, for huge wealth where you trade off a lot of your principles would be a terrible mistake.

I can certainly define happiness because that's what I am. I mean I get to do what I like to do every single day of the year.

I get to do it with people I like. I don't have to associate with anybody that causes my summer to churn. The only thing in my job, I don't like, and this only happens about every three to four years, occasionally I have to fire somebody, and I don't like, that's the only thing.





Other than that, I tap dance to work and I get down there, and I think I'm supposed to lie on my back and paint the ceiling, you know, something like Michael Angelo. I mean that's the way I feel. And it doesn't diminish its tremendous fun.

They say that: "Success is getting what you want, and happiness is wanting what you get."

Well, I don't know which one applies in this case, but I do know that I wouldn't be doing anything else.





I do advise you, you know when you *go out to work go to go to work for an organization that you admire, people you admire,* <u>because it'll</u> <u>turn you on</u> and *you ought to be happy where you are working.*

And, I always worry about people who say you know, "I'm going to do this for ten years, I really don't like it very well, I'll do ten more years of this and"... I mean that's a little like saving up sex for your old age, I mean, not a very good idea.

So get right in on what you enjoy, you know, and you'll be successful at it, you really will. I mean you won't be able to miss.





I don't regard what I do is the most important thing in the world overall, but it's right for me, I mean I happen to be wired in a certain way that what I do works.

And if I had to do, what you know, Bill does I mean, I would last about ten minutes, and that's true about a lot of things but luckily I kind of stumbled into <u>the thing that I do best</u> and that, you know what *it's worked out for me.*
